

BUSINESS MEETING

The Business Meeting of the Ninth Annual South-Central Renaissance Conference was called to order by President Carroll Camden at nine o'clock a.m., Saturday, 2 April, 1960, in the lecture hall, Alumni-Student Building, Mississippi State University. The following items of business were endorsed:

1) The invitation to Southwestern University, Georgetown, Texas, on or about the first or second week-end of March, 1961, was accepted.

2) The conference voted that By-Law 3 of the constitution be amended to read: Dues of one dollar (\$1.00) per year (the fiscal year to begin at the annual meeting of the S-CRC) shall be charged to a member in good standing. *See Amendment no. 6*

3) Waldo F. McNeir (Chairman) reported for the nominating committee. The Conference accepted the slate unanimously:
President: Patrick G. Hogan (Mississippi State University, English)
Vice-President: Carl Hammer, Jr. (LSU, German)
Secretary: Lorraine Sherley (TCU, English)
Council Members for two-year terms: Louis A. Schuster (St. Mary's University, English); F. E. Gaupp (Southwestern University, History)
Regional Representative to RSA for a two year term: William Burgett (University of Oklahoma, Architecture)
Constituent Delegate to SHC: Lorraine Sherley

4) Through Waldo McNeir the Conference offered its commendation to The Rice Institute for the publication of the papers read at the Eighth S-CRC, 1959, and recommended that the Conference continue the splendid precedent.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 9:15.
